All students must meet the on-campus [enrollment requirement](#), which includes attending classes in-person and fulfilling research commitments and expectations (if applicable). As an international student you are in the United States to study and your first priority is your academics. In a student's final semester, when no other coursework is required, a TPS graduate student may request to pursue an out-of-state internship opportunity. All eligibility criteria must be met. TPS will not grant permission for out-of-state internships for students with coursework in the fall or spring semester, no exceptions.

TPS Academic Advising does not recommend that you complete an out of state internship while a student in the fall or spring semesters. If you intend on applying for Post-OPT, STEM OPT and/or H-1B, please note that USCIS may audit your case and require you to provide proof of being on campus during the semester(s) you were working an out-of-state internship. They could observe that your classroom studies were not your priority, and thus determine you violated the F-1 visa requirements and deny you future U.S. immigration benefits.

We encourage you to think through all the ramifications of doing an out of state internship while also a student before committing to an out-of-state internship opportunity. You are also required to meet with the ISSC advisor to review potential ramifications of your future immigration status before TPS advising will approve your request.

_____ I may be asked to provide proof of my on-campus presence by USCIS.
